



**COUNTY OF REEVES, TEXAS  
ADDENDUM NO. 1 TO ORDER NO. 10  
REQUIRING BUSINESSES TO REDUCE OCCUPANCY TO FIFTY (50%) PERCENT  
and CLOSING BARS and SIMILAR ESTABLISHMENTS and CERTAIN  
RESTAURANTS**

**DATE ADDENDUM ISSUED: NOVEMBER 24, 2020**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the letter dated November 23, 2020 attached from John Hellerstedt, M.D., Commissioner of the Texas Department of State Health Services, which states in part:

For the past seven days, the number of COVID-19 hospitalized patients in Trauma Service Area J as a percentage of total hospital capacity exceeds 15 percent, making it an area with high hospitalizations as defined above. As a result, as of November 23, 2020, all restaurants, retail stores, office buildings, manufacturing facilities, gyms and exercise facilities and classes, museums, and libraries in all counties in Trauma Service Area J are required to return to maximum 50 percent occupancy levels, except in any county that separately qualifies for the greater occupancy levels because it has minimal cases of COVID-19 under the Department of State Health Services attestation process.

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Executive Order GA-32 issued by Governor Abbott on October 7, 2020, due to the high level of hospitalizations due to Covid-19 in Trauma Service Area J and the current levels of active Covid-19 cases in Reeves County, the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) has revoked Reeves County's attestation since we no longer meet the requirements for bars and similar establishments to remain open.

**THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY LEO HUNG, THE COUNTY JUDGE OF REEVES COUNTY, TEXAS:**


1. Since Reeves County does not qualify for greater occupancy levels due to the current number of active Covid-19 cases, all restaurants which are not subject to No. 3 below, retail stores, office buildings, manufacturing facilities, gyms and exercise facilities and classes, museums, and libraries in Reeves County shall be required to return to a maximum of 50% of occupancy levels as directed above by Dr. John Hellerstedt in an effort to reduce the number of hospitalizations in Trauma Service Area J, to which Reeves County belongs. Such compliance will continue until further notice from the Texas Department of State Health Services and/or Texas Governor Greg Abbott.

2. All bars or similar establishments which hold a permit from the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) shall close effective immediately until further notice.

3. All restaurants which have 51% or more of their gross receipts from the sale of alcohol shall close effective immediately until further notice.

Reeves County Order No. 10 remains in full force and effect.
